Special Events Application Procedures for 2025

Applications are now being accepted from organizations and individuals wishing to hold special events at City-owned venues or on City streets or sidewalks. We have adjusted the dates and for 2025 events, the review process begins November 30, 2024. Annual events are given priority provided the request is received by November 30, after which time applications will be addressed as first-time events on a first-come, first-served basis, based on availability. After November 30, applications must be received at least thirty days prior to the event and will be subject to the same terms and conditions as those applications received prior to November 30.
