Parksville's 2024-2028 Financial Plan

On April 29, Council gave three readings to the amended 2024-2028 financial plan, the 2024 property tax rates bylaw, and water and sewer rates bylaws. Guided by Council priorities, the City's annual budget is part of the five-year financial plan which sets the priority services, programs and initiatives for the next five years and how the City will pay for them. It is the City's goal to balance the pressures of a growing community with ongoing maintenance, expected service levels and infrastructure improvements and where possible, reduce the burden on residents. Tax notices will be mailed towards the end of May and Let's Talk Parksville provides up-to-date information.

Asset Management Updates

Let's Talk Parksville explains asset management in detail and each month provides some info about an infrastructure renewal project. The April update which highlighted the Moss Avenue capital project currently wrapping up, included:

- Renewal of ~500m of roadway
- 11 new streetlights
- Replacement of ~650m of drainage main
- Replacement of ~550m of water main
- Replacement of ~350m of sewer main

Much of the old infrastructure was installed in 1974-1975 and was nearing or exceeding its estimated useful life. Renewal allows retirement of outdated asbestos concrete piping in favour of newer thermoplastic piping materials and helps to safeguard against failure due to aging infrastructure. This ensures the citizens on Moss Avenue can enjoy the same service levels in the future as they have in past.

Part of the asset management process is to review the condition of our aging infrastructure and prioritize renewal projects based on available funding and capacity. Moss Avenue is a great example of asset management at work!

REMINDERS AND THINGS TO KNOW..

Water Restriction Stage 2 is now in effect from May 1 through September 30 (unless otherwise notified) and allows for every other day lawn watering between 7 and 10 am OR 7 and 10 pm for a maximum of two hours. Please note vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from watering restrictions.



During summer months, our water use can double mainly due to outdoor uses such as watering lawns and gardens

and washing cars and outdoor surfaces. Region-wide water use restrictions are an effective way to reduce summer demand and ensure supply for essential services. We encourage all residents to conserve where possible; taking conservation measures early, before our water supplies come under stress, is essential to ensure we can maintain an adequate water supply throughout the hot dry summers we have come to expect. Special watering permits to support newly planted or turfed lawns and/or landscaping are available on our **website** and may also be obtained from our operations department, 1116 Herring Gull Way, 8 am to 4 pm, Monday to Friday.

Permissive Tax Exemptions - under the provisions of the *Community Charter*, Council may exempt land and/or improvements from municipal property taxes for the next calendar year, subject to certain requirements which in general, restrict exemption to non-profit organizations using the lands for specific non-profit purposes. Application deadline is 4 pm, June 28. Details, form and policy may be obtained from City Hall or from the **website**.

Recycle BC pop-up depot in Parksville will continue this year, accepting free of charge, flexible plastic packaging, white and coloured foam packaging, glass packaging and paper packaging and cardboard. Materials may be dropped off from 10 am to 3 pm at 1080 Industrial Way, Parksville. For dates and more info visit Recycle BC website.
