Parksville's 2024-2028 Financial Plan

The 2024-2028 financial plan, tax rates and utility rates bylaws were given final adoption by Council at the meeting on May 6. The bylaws reflect a 6.6% increase in general municipal property taxes, a 5% increase in metered water and water parcel tax rates, and a 3% increase in sanitary sewer usage and parcel tax rates. The estimated increase for an average priced home is \$171.

Highlights from the 2024-2028 financial plan include investments in capital assets and infrastructure renewal in the years 2024 to 2028:

- \$1.5 million asphalt patching, overlays, crack sealing in 2024
- \$750,000 Drinking Water Master Plan
- \$100,000 Shelly Road Centre playground
- \$3.675 million per year, roads and drainage infrastructure renewal
- \$150,000 replacement of critical emergency communications infrastructure
- \$2 million Parksville Pathway project (Parksville Community Park to Englishman River estuary)
- \$500,000 utilities instrumentation and controls renewal
- \$825,000 per year water and sanitary sewer infrastructure renewal

Reserve funds established by Council contain funds which have been set aside for specific purposes as directed by a requirement of provincial or federal legislation, or by a decision of Council. Maintaining adequate reserves and surplus play a significant role in achieving a level of financial stability for Parksville



taxpayers. Such reserves include long-term capital infrastructure renewal and replacement, current capital funding (roads/asphalt overlay, storm drainage, water, and sewer) and protective services operating and capital (fire and police).

Property tax notices will be mailed at the end of May and the due date for property taxes is Tuesday, July 2, 2024, with penalties as follows:

- Regardless of payment method, payment must be received at the City of Parksville by the due date of Tuesday, July 2, 2024, or be subject to an immediate 5% penalty.
- An additional 5% penalty will be applied to current year property taxes outstanding at the end of business on September 16.

- Penalties are also applied to any unclaimed homeowner grants.

Meetings to consider the 2024-2028 financial plan began in late 2023 with Committee of the Whole and Council meetings held into April. The City's financial plan and staff presentations from the meetings may be viewed on Let's Talk Parksville. As well, the meetings are archived and may be viewed on our website through webstreaming.

Water Restriction Stage 2

We encourage all residents to conserve where possible; taking conservation measures early, before our water supplies come under stress, is essential to ensure we can maintain an adequate water supply throughout the hot dry summers we have come to expect.

Stage 2 is in effect from May 1 through September 30 (unless otherwise notified) and allows for every other day

lawn watering between 7 and 10 am OR 7 and 10 pm for a maximum of two hours. Please note vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from watering restrictions. During summer months, our water use can double mainly due to outdoor uses such as watering lawns and gardens and washing cars and outdoor surfaces. Region-wide water use restrictions are an effective way to reduce summer demand and ensure supply for essential services. Please direct questions to **bylaw@parksville.ca**

REMINDERS AND THINGS TO KNOW...

Construction at Church and Wembley Roads

Residents should be aware of ongoing work over the next six months to facilitate construction at 413 Wembley Road. The work includes storm, sanitary and water, curbs and sidewalks and paving later in construction. Vehicles will experience additional traffic at Church Road and Wembley Road and intermittent single lane alternating traffic. Please slow down and obey the instructions of traffic control personnel.

Reminder for Residents - No Open Burning or Fireworks

Parksville Fire Rescue is reminding residents that all open burning and outdoor fires, excluding cooking fires, are prohibited in the Parksville Fire Protection Area. As well, beach fires in the Parksville Qualicum Wildlife Management are prohibited by provincial legislation; this includes all



beaches from French Creek to Resort Drive. The Parksville Fire Protection Area encompasses the City of Parksville and contract areas within the Regional District of Nanaimo which include San Pareil, Morningstar, Columbia Beach, French Creek, and the Fourneau Road, Wildgreen and Martindale Road areas as well as the Forever Green Estates.

The sale of any type of fireworks is prohibited in the City of Parksville and all fireworks are banned within City limits. This includes the possession of consumer fireworks; fireworks should not be purchased elsewhere and brought into the City of Parksville. A person must not fire or discharge fireworks unless authorized by a permit.

Permissive Tax Exemptions

Under the provisions of the *Community Charter*, Council may exempt land and/or improvements from municipal property taxes for the next calendar year, subject to certain requirements which in general, restrict exemption to non-profit organizations using the lands for specific non-profit purposes. Application deadline is 4 pm, June 28. Details, form and policy may be obtained from City Hall or from the **website**.

Recycle BC Pop-up Depot

The depot in Parksville is accepting free of charge, flexible plastic packaging, white and coloured foam packaging, glass packaging and paper packaging and cardboard.
