REMINDERS AND THINGS TO KNOW...

Property Taxes Due July 2

Property tax notices will be mailed this week. If you do not receive your notice by June 10, please phone the City at 250 248-6144. Payments must be received and homeowner grants must be claimed by the due date of July 2 to avoid a penalty.



All eligible homeowners are required to apply for their homeowner grant with the Province of BC at **gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant** or by phone at 1 888 355-2700. When making a payment at a bank or through online banking, please allow a minimum of two business days for bank processing time. Regardless of your payment method, payment must be received at the City of Parksville by the due

date of Tuesday, July 2 or be subjected to an immediate 5% penalty. An additional 5% penalty will be applied to current year property taxes outstanding at the end of business on September 16. Penalties are also applied to any unclaimed homeowner grants.

The 2024-2028 financial plan, tax rates and utility rates bylaws were given final adoption by Council in May. The bylaws reflect a 6.6% increase in general municipal property taxes, a 5% increase in metered water and water parcel tax rates, and a 3% increase in sanitary sewer usage and parcel tax rates. City's 2023 Annual Report Available for Review

Each year, the City of Parksville produces an annual report which is a snapshot of goals and accomplishments and includes reports from the Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer as well as department achievements, permissive tax exemptions and financial statements and information.

The *Community Charter* requires all municipalities prepare an annual report before June 30 each year and under the provisions of the *Community Charter*, the annual report is available for public inspection at least 14 days prior to Council considering the report. The annual report includes the following:

- Progress report on the performance of the City compared to established objectives.
- 2023 financial statements and supplemental financial information.
- List of the tax exemptions provided by Council and for each exemption, the amount of property taxes which would have been imposed on the property in 2023 if not exempt.



• Report on municipal services and operations.

Water Conservation Stage 2

We encourage all residents to conserve where possible; taking conservation measures early, before our water supplies come under stress, is essential to ensure we can maintain an adequate water supply throughout the hot dry summers we have come to expect.



Stage 2 is in effect from May 1 through September 30 (unless otherwise notified) and allows for every other

day lawn watering between 7 and 10 am OR 7 and 10 pm for a maximum of two hours. Please note vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from watering restrictions. During summer months, our water use can double mainly due to outdoor uses such as watering lawns and gardens and washing cars and outdoor surfaces. Region-wide water use restrictions are an effective way to reduce summer demand and ensure supply for essential services. Please direct questions to **bylaw@parksville.ca**

Boulevard and Sidewalk Maintenance

Well maintained boulevards add character to neighbourhoods and enhance community pride. Residents, property owners and business operators are responsible for the maintenance and care of the City boulevard adjacent to their property. This includes cutting the grass, trimming hedges and shrubs, and keeping clear of weeds and litter.



The boulevard is the area between your property line and the street curb or shoulder which may or may not include a sidewalk. Property owners and residents are required to maintain the City boulevard bordering their property, where it borders the front, back or sides of the property. In our climate, vegetation grows quickly and can easily become a nuisance or hazard if not managed regularly.

In the City's bylaw, "boulevard" means the area of a highway between the edge of pavement, sidewalk, and/or curb of the roadway and the adjacent property line but excludes a sidewalk. As detailed in the City's

Traffic Bylaw No. 1436, in keeping with a reasonable standard of maintenance, property owners must maintain the boulevard adjoining their property:

- Keep grassed areas trimmed and free of all weeds
- Trim and maintain all plantings
- Remove all garbage and recycling, leaves, rubbish, discarded materials, hazardous objects and materials from boulevards and sidewalks
- Maintain safe pedestrian access to sidewalks
- Maintain safe sightlines for vehicle traffic

Should there be an issue with maintenance of City trees on boulevards, please email **ops@parksville.ca** and we will respond to concerns. Property owners should not cause damage, cut down, or remove City trees.

Please note, failure to maintain boulevards may result in enforcement action from City bylaw compliance officers. Questions should be directed to bylaw@parksville.ca
