# CITY SERVICES

#### Property Taxes Due July 2

If you have not received your 2024 tax notice, phone 250 248-6144. Payments must be received, and homeowner grants claimed by due date of July 2 to avoid a penalty. All eligible homeowners are required to apply for their homeowner grant with the Province of BC at gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant or by phone at 1888 355-2700. When making a payment at a bank or through online banking, allow minimum of two business days for bank processing. Regardless of method, payment must be received at the City by July 2 or be subjected to an immediate 5% penalty. An additional 5% penalty will be applied to current year property taxes outstanding at the end of business on September 16. Penalties are also applied to any unclaimed homeowner grants.

The 2024-2028 financial plan, tax rates and utility rates bylaws were given final adoption by Council in May. The bylaws reflect a 6.6% increase in general municipal property taxes, a 5% increase in metered water and water parcel tax rates, and a 3% increase in sanitary sewer usage and parcel tax rates. # You Know It's Summer When...the Pym Street garden is planted!

The much-loved annual Pym Street garden display, different every year, is designed and created by our talented parks team and is meant to bring awareness about bees and their habitat.

Bees play a crucial role in our ecosystem as pollinators, aiding in the reproduction of many plants and crops that we rely on for food. However, these essential creatures are facing a concerning decline in population. To raise awareness about this issue and to provide a haven for our beloved bees, the Pym Street display garden is dedicated to showcasing their importance and the beauty of their habitat. The garden will serve as a sanctuary for bees and other pollinators, offering them a safe space to thrive.

In other areas of the City, we are cultivating more native plants which will support bees as well. Native plant flowers provide bees with a diverse and abundant source of nectar and pollen, essential for their survival and well-being. These untamed beauties not only offer sustenance but also create a rich and biodiverse ecosystem that benefits both bees and other wildlife.

Native plants are nature's resilience champions against drought! Unlike their non-native counterparts, they've evolved over centuries to thrive in our local climates, making them more resilient to dry spells. The parks team will mix native plants along with drought tolerant non-native plants in many City flower beds to better adapt to our dry summers.



## REMINDERS AND THINGS TO KNOW

#### Lights on Alberni Highway

During the week of June 24, a City contractor will reconfigure the lights on the trees along Alberni Highway. Work, which is scheduled to begin Monday, June 24, between the hours of 7.30 am to 3.30 pm, will most likely take the better part of the week. The existing lights will be replaced as needed and additional lights added to enhance lighting on Alberni Highway.

The contractor will begin the work near the Royal Bank on the east side of Alberni Highway, moving towards the Chevron Station at Highway 19A. The second phase

of the work will start at the CIBC at Highway 19A working up Alberni Highway to the Rod and Gun liquor store. During the week of June 24, parking on Alberni Highway will be interrupted. As the lights are installed and it is safe to do so, parking spaces will be made available.

#### **Permissive Tax Exemptions**

Under the provisions of the *Community Charter*, Council may exempt land and/or improvements from municipal property taxes for the next calendar year, subject to certain requirements which in general, restrict exemption to non-profit organizations using the lands for specific non-profit purposes. Deadline is 4 pm, June 28. Details, form and policy may be obtained from City Hall or from the website.

#### Stage 2 water restriction

Residents are encouraged to conserve where possible; taking conservation measures early, before our water supplies come under stress, is essential to ensure we can maintain an adequate water supply throughout the hot dry summers we have come to expect. **Stage 2** is in effect through September 30 (unless otherwise notified). Stage 2 allows for every other day lawn watering between 7-10 am OR 7-10 pm for a maximum of two hours. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from all watering restrictions. #### No Open Burning or Fireworks

Parksville Fire Rescue reminds residents in the Parksville Fire Protection Area that all open burning and outdoor fires, excluding cooking fires, are prohibited. At this time, campfires are allowed. Please be aware, beach fires in the Parksville Qualicum Wildlife Management are always prohibited by provincial legislation. Fireworks are prohibited in the City as is the sale of any



type of fireworks. Report beach fires to RAPP line at 1 877 952-7277 and fireworks should be reported to the RCMP.

#### Recycle BC Pop-up Depot

The depot in Parksville is accepting free of charge, flexible plastic packaging, white and coloured foam packaging, glass packaging and paper packaging and cardboard. Materials may be dropped off from 10 am to 3 pm at 1080 Industrial Way, Parksville on June 22, July 6, July 13, July 27, and August 10. For more dates and info, visit Recycle BC website.
