Stage 3 Watering Restrictions

Earlier this month, the City implemented Stage 3 water conservation measures. Stage 3 maintains the same even and odd day watering framework as Stage 2 and encourages residents to further reduce consumption to defer a comprehensive watering ban, offering flexibility for residents to decide where and how to reduce outdoor water use. Watering of vegetable gardens and fruit trees and drip irrigation is exempt from restrictions.



The province now lists eastern Vancouver Island as Drought level 4, "adverse impacts to socio-economic or ecosystem values are likely" and continues to call on communities to reduce water consumption, especially outdoor use. Reduction in water use is critical and by proactively conserving groundwater and surface water, we ensure water supply resiliency for essential household use, fire protection, stream flows for fish, and irrigation purposes. The City has several water licences issued by the province for drinking water purposes and when the Arrowsmith Dam was constructed, the City committed to releasing water to the Englishman River in drier months to add to the base flow, which is beneficial for fish and the riparian ecosystem. To prolong the release of water from the dam, a reduction in the flow release has been approved which requires the City to implement Stage 3 conservation levels.

Transportation Master Plan Moving Right Along



Mobi-mat Installed at Parksville Bay Beach

In partnership with Access Oceanside Association, the city is excited to pilot a mobimat installation for the 2024 summer season. An accessible beach mat, also known as a mobi-mat, is now in place on Parksville Bay beach, accessed from the concrete ramp in front of the waterfront gazebo. The new 100 foot-long mobi-mat will enable easier beach access for people using wheelchairs, families with strollers and others to access the water.

Parksville Council confirmed its intent to review beach accessibility in 2025; however, this opportunity arose thanks to the donation by Corona Canada who offered to gift an accessibility mat to an oceanfront community. The generous and unexpected donation of the mobi-mat to Access Oceanside Association prompted Council to amend its workplan and move this item forward to the 2024 budget cycle. Staff applied for the necessary permits from the federal and provincial agencies and were successful in receiving expedited approvals based on the significance of improving accessibility in the community.

Parksville Council embraces universal accessibility as a goal for the community and acknowledges many of our residents and visitors experience mobility challenges, either permanent or temporary and accessing natural spaces can be difficult for those with physical limitations. Accessibility principles benefit all people, including young families with strollers, people with injuries and those with more long-term mobility issues.

At this time, there are some unknowns about how this new service will impact staffing and how it will operate in a dynamic marine environment. The seasonal installation of a mobi-mat is a higher level of service than the City is accustomed to and over the next few months, staff will monitor the use and track issues which may arise with maintenance and operations. Council will review the information from both City staff and the community during its 2025 budget deliberations and provide

direction for future accessibility projects at that time.

The donation by Corona Canada also included two beach wheelchairs which may be reserved free of charge through the Beach Club Resort, 250 248-8999 or beachclub@bellstar.ca. More info on the city's website.
