Gathering Plaza Survey

Parksville residents and all users of the Parksville Community Park are invited to provide feedback and ideas about the new gathering plaza in the Parksville Community Park; how the space is used and how the space could be used in the future.

Major improvements and upgrades to amenities in the Parksville Community Park were completed earlier this year and we are pleased to see the spaces being used extensively by the public. We listened to concerns from park users who will now be better served with the new washroom building, improved accessible connections throughout the park, upgraded sports courts, new fencing at the sand volleyball courts, the new gathering space, and improved drop off areas.

We understand public spaces are important for community engagement, relaxing and socializing. With this survey, we hope to learn from visitors how the new gathering plaza space is being used and how it could be used in the future. Whether it's adding more greenery, organized events, or seating options, we want to hear from you. Participating in this survey is a voice in ensuring the gathering plaza space continues to be a vibrant, inviting, and inclusive space that enhances quality of life and fosters a sense of community.


Repairs to Waterfront Walkway Parksville Community Park

The first phase of the City's waterfront walkway replacement project is now underway and is expected to be complete near the end of October. An area of the

walkway, about 375 square metres or just over 4,000 square feet adjacent to the waterfront gazebo and the sandcastles area will undergo replacement of timber decking and curbing. As well, the two long curved benches will be replaced. Subsequent phases over the next three to four years will see replacement of the entire waterfront walkway.

During the work, this section of the waterfront walkway will be closed to the public and park users will need to reroute through the Parksville Community Park. Signage, fencing and barricades will indicate the work zone.





We are now in the third round of community engagement for Parksville's transportation master plan and need your feedback to ensure we're on the right track. You are invited to the third engagement open house on October 1 from 2-7 pm in the Forum, 100 Jensen Avenue East. Presentations by the project consultant are scheduled for 3 pm and 5 pm.

We are asking for your feedback to help guide project priorities as well as provide your final thoughts on areas for future improvement. Phase 3 will focus on developing practical recommendations for transportation infrastructure improvements to support the needs of Parksville over the next twenty years. This final engagement will present the recommended projects and improvements across all modes of travel (auto, transit, walking, and cycling) with the goal of confirming with the community that the plan is capturing a balanced and practical approach to achieving the City's mobility goals. There will be opportunities to provide this feedback at the open house on October 1 and as part of a third online survey which will be open from October 1 through November 3.

The City began developing a transportation master plan in July 2023. In the first round of public engagement, ending in December 2023, the public told us what they wanted in general terms. This information was then used to develop direction for policies, projects and planning. Phase 2 engagement was completed in April 2024 with more than 700 people responding to the phase 2 survey. The second **What We Heard report** was made available in July with the results helping to further refine the policies, projects and planning developed after the first engagement. Our thanks to everyone who participated to help shape this plan.

We look forward to completing the third and final phase of the transportation master plan project which will finalize recommended projects with costs, funding sources, and a plan for implementation. The final recommendations will be presented to Council for consideration in early 2025. More info and details about this project may be viewed on **Let's Talk Parksville**.

In response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's findings, September 30 has been designated as National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day honours the Indigenous people impacted by the residential school system in Canada, the children who never returned home, and the survivors of residential schools in Canada, as well as the resiliency of their families and communities.

In acknowledgement of the important contribution Indigenous people and communities provide and in the spirit of reconciliation, the PCTC will be lit in orange and the commemorative flag will be flown from September 23 through October 3. City offices will be closed on September 30 for the statutory holiday.

There is a growing awareness of the importance of this day and the conversation about what reconciliation truly means. September 30 is also Orange Shirt Day, intended to raise awareness of the inter-generational impacts of residential schools and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters." The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by

Indigenous children over generations. We encourage all to wear orange to honour the thousands of survivors of residential schools.

The City of Parksville recognizes with gratitude, the people of the Coast Salish Nations and the traditional territory of the Snaw-Naw-As First Nation and the Qualicum First Nation.

REMINDERS AND THINGS TO KNOW

Property Tax Sale

Property tax accounts with delinquent taxes (outstanding from 2022) on October 7, 2024, are subject to tax sale which, if required, will be held in the Forum, Parksville Civic and Technology Centre (100 Jensen Avenue East) at 10 am on October 7.

Late Payment of Property Taxes

A 5% penalty was applied to current year property taxes and unclaimed homeowner grants outstanding after the due date of July 2, 2024. An additional 5% penalty will be applied to current year property taxes and unclaimed homeowner grants that remain outstanding at the end of business on September 16. Penalties are applied in accordance with Sections 233 and 234 of the Community Charter and City of Parksville Bylaw No. 1583. The City has no authority to either waive or modify these penalty amounts.
